This program was not designed to replace current programs, it is designed to help those programs. The Community Crusade Against Drugs markets two drug education magazines, Listen for teens and Winner for pre-teens. The magazines provide a consistent “no-use” message regarding drugs and violence by using positive role models and scientific facts. In addition to the no-use for drug message, the magazines also cover topics such as anger, bullying, character, conflict, guidance, health/safety, nutrition, sex and tobacco. The cost of the magazines is \$27.00 per year for Listen and \$18.00 per year for Winner. Currently, there are 3 Henderson County Schools that have requested these magazines for their students. The program does not charge schools for the magazines, so contributions are needed. The total cost for the 3 Henderson County Schools is \$2,890.
