President Ron reminded everyone about the upcoming District Conference taking place on April 28th and 29th in Louisville. See Ron for more information.

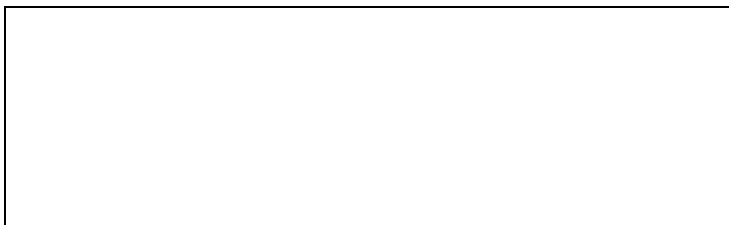
